

The Annual Quality Assurance Report

**Name – Mahatma Phule College of Social Work, Taloda,
Dist. Nandurbar (M.S) Year—2008-09**

Part—A

The main points of the Action Plan –

1. **Infrastructure Development-** in view of the felt need of an auditorium , the **Governing Body** of the college should be requested to construct a decent auditorium on the second floor. It should have a capacity of two hundred chairs.
The hall should be well equipped with audio-visual aids.
2. The posts of lecturers and other vacant posts should be filled up as per the Government and the University norms during 2008-09.
3. The social work college staff should be encouraged to attend at least one state level and / national level seminar, workshop. Similarly, leave should be granted to the teachers having more than five years of teaching experience for attending refresher courses or orientation courses.
4. The staff and possibly the students should engage themselves in evaluation research and the faculty should undertake field action projects.
5. A scheme should be launched so as to ensure recognition of teachers for their specific achievement like obtaining PhD/ M. Phil or any outstanding work.
Similarly, best student award may be given to at least one male and one female student for his or her out- standing contribution by means of success in university examination, National service scheme or any other field like cultural activities.
6. The subcommittee headed by the Principal and consisting of two lecturers should see whether it would be feasible to apply dress code for the staff as well as the students of BSW and

MSW courses.

7. Sufficient number of desks should be purchased. The cupboards and chairs in adequate numbers should be purchased.
8. Guest lecturers should be invited to teach some portion of the syllabus especially for specific subjects like English and Applied Statistics. The guest lecturers may be paid honorarium as may be admissible.
9. The Annual Gathering may be organized jointly with the Arts and Comm. College, Taloda. Besides ensuring huge audience it may help curb expenses on cultural activities.
10. An university level or state level seminar should be organized on advanced research techniques for the staff and students of the College. The Principal has suggested a workshop on office management skills for delegates of all the colleges in the District of Nandurbar. The decision may be taken after holding consultation with the President of the association of non-teaching staff of the colleges in Nandurbar District.
11. The college library should be enriched by adding at least 3000 books and additional number of journals. Besides making available adequate number of books, additional number of posts may be sanctioned for the library including the posts of Professional Assistant and Assistant Librarian. The college should approach the concerned authority in this regard.
12. The college should promote sports among the students by purchasing required sports materials/items and providing training to the students participating in zonal or university level sports events.
13. The provision should be made for inculcating computer application skills especially for MSW final year students. This will increase their employability. It is further suggested that the college should not charge any fees for computer training sessions.

14. A provision of at least Rs.50000/-should be made in the budget for 2008-09 to provide for furniture and additional number of books and journals.

Part- B

No new programs were started during this year. However, the college strengthened the efforts to ensure all-round development of the students of the College.

1. The construction of an auditorium on the second floor has been near completion. The hall measures 55 feet X 27 ft. and has a smooth impervious surface and adequate ventilation and lighting facility.
2. **The Yuvti Sabha, a forum for the girl students** organized certain programs for the girls under the guidance of the Principal and the chairperson, Prof. Ms. U.B. Vasave. The forum was inaugurated on August 2, 2008, at the hands of renowned Advocate Ms. Alkatali Yawalkar of Dhule, recipient of Ahilyabai Holkar Award of the Government of Maharashtra. She elaborated the need for women empowerment through greater protection of law. She illustrated the cases of domestic violence and the laws for women.
3. **Recruitment of lecturers:**
In view of the need for employing qualified lecturers, the college initiated the process of selection of lecturers. The draft advertisement was sanctioned by the university vide its letter No. NMU/18/14B/392/2008 dated 02-04-2008. The selection committee met on 03-12-2008. The lone candidate having cleared the SET/NET was duly selected and appointed as lecturer in social work from 1st day of Jan.2009. However, within a couple of months he resigned from the post he held as he was selected in a college under

grant-in –aid .

4. Dr. Subhash Patil delivered a talk on personality development on September 13, 2008. Five girls attended a workshop organized by the College of Education Shahada.
5. **Vivek Vahini**, a platform for creating scientific temper was inaugurated at the hands of Prof. Dr. Anil Baisane of Dondaicha . He also delivered a lecture on Indian tradition of intellectualism organized several programs aimed at removal of blind faiths. Most of the students of the college belong to tribal community of the district which is prone to blind faiths-witchcrafts, black magic etc. The importance of such awareness building programs can hardly be underestimated. The students in turn are associated with a state wide campaign for removal of Dakin Pratha in tribal regions..
6. Dr. Kishor Samudre with a view to create awareness demonstrated the magical tricks performed by the swindlers and religious mendicants. The program was organized as a part of field work activities at Modalpada Tal. Taloda. The MLA of the taluka, Adv. Padmakarji Valvi was present along with his wife.
7. **The research projects completed-** newly undertaken by the college—
 - a) Two lecturers and 24 students of the college undertook an evaluation study of a nutrition program implemented through ICDS in the District of Nandurbar. The study was sponsored by Rajmata Jijao Balak Potion Mission, Aurangabad, an unit of the Government of Maharashtra.
 - b) An evaluation study was undertaken by/ for Communication and Research Institute, Bhopal. All of the six talukas in the District of Nandurbar were covered. The study was carried out by eighteen students of the college in the month of December 2008.
 - c) The college was selected for implementation of a special

drive undertaken by Zilla Parishad, Nandurbar for awareness building for cleanliness and environmental hygiene. The major thrust of the drive was construction of private latrines by the villagers. “Hagandari mukt gaon” (no defecation in open) was the concept taken to the villagers by organizing a residential camp in Khushgavan village in Taloda Taluka between 23-09-2008 and 02-10-2008. Forty students and two professors actively participated in the special camp. Rs.40000/- were granted by the Z.P Nandubar.

- d) A massive survey of 25000 BPL families living in 161 villages in Akran Mahal i.e Dhadgaon Tehsil in the District of Nandurbar was carried out by six faculty and 125 students of the BSW and MSW classes. The survey was a fact finding study under the Rural Employment Guarantee scheme. The survey was undertaken in the first half of July 2008. A sum of Rs.3,43000/- was sanctioned by Zilla Parishad Nandurbar. A sum of Rs. 25000/- was paid to the poor tribal students for data feeding job. The college made available to them the computers.
8. **Promotion of sports**—though the post of Director of Physical Education is not sanctioned to the colleges of social work, with the help extended by Prof. P.P.Bhoge of the Arts and Comm. College Taloda some of our students did well at inter university sports tournaments. Ms. Sharayu Dhumal of MSW represented the University at Chandigarh. Similarly, Ms. Anita Pawara, a tribal student of our college represented North Maharashtra University ,Jalgaon by leading a team of athletes at Aswamedh sport events organized by Mahatma Phule Agri. University, Rahuri.
9. Making provision of computer literacy and acquiring functional computer skills have become a need of the hour. Hence the college decided to enter into a contract with Bright Computers

Ltd. ,a Taloda based training institution recognized by MKCL to provide theoretical and practical training in computer applications. The Director of the computer institution himself conducted lectures and practicals in the second term of 2008-09.

10. **Library Development**—the increase in number of students of both BSW and MSW courses has put forth a need for increasing number of relevant books in the library of the college. At the beginning of 2008-09 there were 4241 books and 49 journals worth Rs.586588 and rs.19000 respectively. During the academic year the college has added 602 books and journals costing Rs. 139959.

11. **Campus Interview**

The College organized a Campus Interview on 7th day of March,2009 with the initiative of Pune (Rajguru Nagar) based NGO -Chaitanya. Fifty students of BSW III and MSW II appeared for the Test conducted by the NGO. Out of them five were selected for appointment and 15 Girls were selected for Placement training. The NGO appreciated the overwhelming response of the students and the faculty. Hats off to Dr. Sudha Kothari, Director and Ms.Kalpana Pant, J.Director and their colleagues for giving such a novel opportunity to 15 Tribal girls.

12. **Community services**—

Under the fieldwork program of the college efforts are made to improve the service delivery system. Working with the governmental and voluntary agencies, thus, leads to community service. The teachers and students of the college organized health check up camps for the blind and the tribal people suffering from sickle cell anaemia at Ganesh Budhaval, a tribal village adopted for field work.

The veterinary camp was held in Mendhawad Tal.Taloda.

13. Office renovation – the college has spent Rs.32217 for making of furniture for keeping records. This is in addition to a counter and office table made by spending Rs. 76452/ during 2006-07.
14. Prof. R.M.Patil has been nominated by the State Government as a non government member on an advisory committee for rehabilitation of the victims of human trafficking for Nandurbar District.

Part- C

Details of the plans of the College for the academic year of 2009-10

1. Networking with the governmental and non governmental agencies to promote employment opportunities for the final year pass outs of the BSW and MSW courses.
2. Rejuvenating alumni Association by organizing annual meets
3. Procuring through purchase or otherwise good quality computers. Since the University has already decided to provide e-suvidha i.e online /digital channels of communication and has entered an MoU with Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation, it would be indispensable to have a scanner, printer and Fax and computers.
4. Library Development- the college library has been enriched every year by procuring relevant books. Though during the current year a huge amount has already been spent on purchase of books, it is necessary to further add books and journals. It is therefore suggested that another Rs.50000/- for purchasing books and Rs.30000for purchase of cupboards should be made in the budget for 2009-10.
